films and music



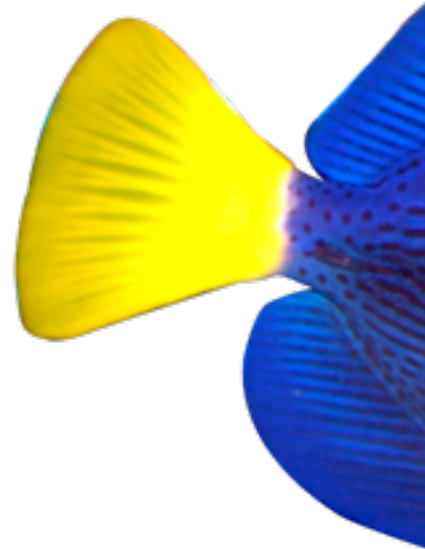
This pack contains materials and ideas for sensory activities linked to Venue Cymru's Take pART which has as one of its themes this year "Recycling plastic and the sea"

## Sensory objects under the sea

With the DVD of under the sea on your screen and the sounds from the film as a background Explore the shells, sponge and textures of the sensory toys together on at a time.

Add other tactile objects and a bowl of warm water to feel what the objects are like when they are wet as well.

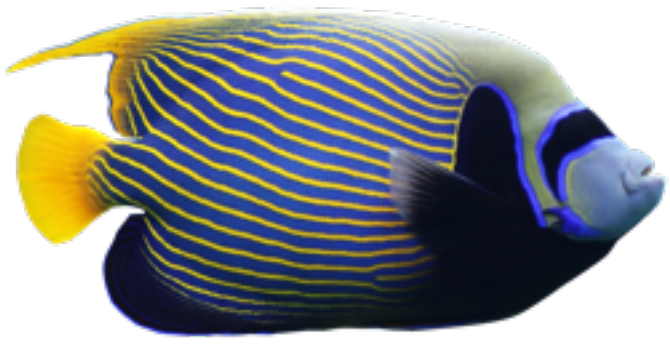


## Turn your box into an aquarium

Create an under sea environment starting with the back of the box using textures like the sponge in the foreground to create coral and sea plants then in contrasting colours make some fish, jelly fish, octopi! and hang them from the roof of your box

You could even incorporate the fairy lights

### **Sensory sea creature challenge**

You will need to collect plastic bottles as a base for your sea creatures.

The challenge is to create sea creatures which

Use recycled materials (alongside anything else you like)

Incorporates as many sensory features as possible - all in one creature

Or different creatures

The materials included in the pack should give you some ideas but feel free to be as creative and inventive as you like

### **Carpet Fishing game**

You will find materials needed to create a fishing game which you can play one to one or as a group

Before you start you can decorate your fish to make them as bright as possible to stand out against the floor!

Add velcro dots to one side of each fish

Make a fishing rod using a stick and string with the cork tied to the end with velcro to attach its self to the fish.

You can just catch fish or have a competition - stick numbers to the underside of the fish and see who can catch the highest score!
